The Lancet report's ranking of health systems performance which utilizes metrics on healthcare access and quality ranks Nigeria 142 out of 195 countries. Access to health care services among youths has been a big challenge due to the attitude of health facility staff towards young people, poor finances, their poor health-seeking behaviour due to inadequate information, fear of the unknown and misconception. This has thus necessitated the need for innovative ways to ensure youth access to health facilities of their choice.

We will co-create solutions to the myriad health problems among young people in Nigeria. In this instance, we will generate ideas that would improve adolescents' access to quality health care.

The Process

This will include a plenary session with previous innovators, followed by a breakout session made up of smaller groups to brainstorm possible innovative ideas. The groups will reconvene after 30 minutes to present their ideas.

Thereafter, 3 innovation ideas will be identified for further follow-up.

SIHI team members will facilitate post-virtual café meetings, including providing support, such as helping with grant writing to support the development of the innovation.



Prof. Umem F. Ekpo is a Professor of Parasitology and Entomology with speciality in parasite epidemiology, control, and elimination. He is the current Programme Leader, the Biosciences Research Programme (BSRP) of the University Institute for Food Security, Environmental Resources and Agricultural Research (IFSERAR), Abeokuta. He is also the founder of "Eliminate NTD" (Neglected Tropical Diseases) Nigeria and has worked both locally and internationally to provide teaching and mentorship on NTDs. By leveraging on health education and awareness as tools for behavioural change, Prof. Umem and his team have developed and implemented innovations such as the Schisto and Ladders™ version 2.0 which targets schistosomiasis awareness in the younger population.
